WORKSHOP'S KEY CONCEPTS

FROM CONCEPT TO SUBMISSION



Build a Submission-Ready Grant: Participants will progressively develop and refine an F-, K-, or R-series NIH grant application (or equivalent) with the goal of preparing it for submission.

MASTER THE ESSENTIALS OF GRANT WRITING



Strengthen Grant-Writing Skills Through Practice: The workshop combines instruction on best practices for key grant components with examples, draft development, and structured peer review.

REFINE YOUR GRANT THROUGH PEER FEEDBACK



Gain Constructive Feedback and Accountability: Participants will give and receive peer feedback, revise major grant sections throughout the workshop, and stay on track through scheduled draft deadlines and discussion sessions.
